


At the convention, several awards are presented for a variety of causes in keeping with the pillars of the American Legion. One such award is the American Legion Department of California Law Enforcement Officer of the Year for Valor. This award is voted upon by the Law and Order Commission. In a unanimous vote by the commission, Deputy Claudia Apolinar was selected as the 2021 Law Enforcement Officer of the Year for Valor.

The events surrounding Deputy Apolinar's actions should not be lost on anyone.

Her bravery and courage after having been shot in the face, and her resilience to keep herself and her partner alive were nothing short of extraordinary. Deputy Apolinar exemplifies the best qualities of the men and women on the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department. Star Post 309 was proud to have nominated her for this award, and even more proud that she was selected as the honoree.

Each clause was uttered by a different American Legion member. How appropriate that the phrase, "To maintain law and order" was stated by our very own, Sheriff Alex Villanueva.

Among them were the Media Award for Post Newsletter, Membership Award for achieving over 100% of the year's membership goal, Gold Brigade Award for bringing in over 50 new members to the American Legion, Law and Order Program Award, and the Law Enforcement Officer of the Year Award for Deputy Claudia Apolinar. We want to thank our delegates for representing the Post, and we hope that next year we can once again attend in person.

We want to give a special congratulations to our new Department Commander, Mr. Autrey James. Autrey is a former police officer who later became a deputy district attorney with Alameda County. Commander James hopes to bring to our organization new life and new direction. His motto, "One Team, One Fight," should inspire us all to continue progressing forward and advocating for our veterans and their families.

Our Star Post member Hugh Crooks is a Past Department Commander. He had the honor of swearing in Autrey. The image below sends a powerful message. It depicts the great strides our organization has made in terms of diversity. Hugh was only the second African-American Department Commander having served in that capacity from 2011-2012. The first African-American Department Commander was Charlie M. Eskridge who served from 2006-2007.



Daniel wants everyone to know that he is grateful and appreciative to be part of a supportive family. He has found a place in the SCV, and is looking forward to his success in the academy.




#### The 100 Miles for Hope Breakout Challenge has begun!


