



The second round of nominations and elections will be held following our Tree Planting Ceremony. Star Post 309 is an all-volunteer, non-profit veteran service organization. The men and women who take leadership positions within the Post do so by giving of their time for the benefit of our members. We encourage all of our members to participate in a commission or leadership role. During our meeting, we had the honor of hosting our distinguished guest, Ms. Barbara

Lombrano who is the interim American Legion Department of California Adjutant. Ms. Lombrano presented our Post with the All-Time High Post Award – Five or more consecutive years.

This award is for posts who have set an all-time high in their membership for the year. After a post has won the award for five consecutive years of all-time membership highs, it may continue to win the award each year thereafter as long as each year's membership sets a new all-time high. Membership in Star Post 309 has risen from approximately 250 members in 2015-16 to surpassing 720 members in 2020-21, including the creation and establishment of an Auxiliary Unit, Sons of the American Legion Squadron, and most recently an American Legion Riders Chapter.

Also during the meeting, we had the privilege of recognizing a young American. Star Post Member Mitchell Jones introduced his son, Matthew Thomas Jones. Matthew had recently been promoted to Eagle Scout at Troop 2 Riverside. Matthew's project entailed planting a butterfly garden to be located on a designated parcel of land located on the Jurupa Mountain Discovery Center, Jurupa Valley California. This garden would provide a natural habitat and environment for various butterflies to live and flourish. For his efforts and dedication to service, Star Post 309 presented Matthew with a commemorative American Legion Eagle Scout medal, certificate, and patch. We offered Matthew our congratulations and our support to continue his dreams of entering the Naval Academy.





Retired Video Technician and Retired Reserve Deputy Richard N. Teeman transferred to Post Everlasting on April 22, 2021. Richard joined the Sheriff's Department on September 10, 1968, and retired on March 17, 1998, from Scientific Services Bureau (photo lab).

Retired Sergeant Billy Malone passed away at the Veterans Home in Norman, Oklahoma, and transferred to Post Everlasting on April 18, 2021. Billy was 92 years old. He would have been 93 on April 28th. Billy had been in the home for the past eight years battling thyroid cancer.

Billy worked East Los Angeles Stations and was a member of Academy Class 77. He joined the US Navy in 1945 when he was 17 years old. Billy was part of the group that took part in the testing of the atomic bombs at Bikini Atoll. For a time, he was the president of the National Association of Atomic Veterans. With his passing, there remains one Star Post 309 member who is a World War II veteran, Fred Gustin.



World War II veteran Bill Malone has had a life of compelling experiences. The (then) 87-year-old was pursuing a high school degree in California when he enlisted in the U.S. Navy in 1945, one of seven brothers to enter the military.

He served on the aircraft carrier USS Independence during Operation Crossroads and later participated in the first post-war detonation of nuclear weapons. Malone later suffered from cancer-related to his radiation exposure.


But for all of Malone's experiences, there was one thing he needed to get complete: earning his high school diploma. So Wednesday morning, surrounded by three generations of his family at the Norman Veterans Center in Norman, Oklahoma, Malone accepted a degree from Norman High School Principal Scott Beck.

"I finally feel like I accomplished something," Malone said with a smile.

The Los Angeles Veterans Collaborative (LAVC) is a structured network of public, private, and government agencies from across multiple sectors working together to improve the lives of veterans, service members, and military families in Los Angeles County. Our mission is achieved by strategically coordinating and improving veteran access to services, reducing barriers to care, and influencing policy to improve the lives of veterans and their families.

Administered by USC Military and Veterans Programs, the Los Angeles Veterans Collaborative comprises community stakeholders and representatives from more than 300 organizations coordinating services and addressing the needs of veterans and military families in the Los Angeles area. **Registration** is free.



Resources and Information

Although a sensitive topic, it's important to know there are services available to those who may have lost a loved one during the pandemic. In early April, FEMA will begin providing financial assistance for funeral expenses incurred after January 20, 2020, for deaths related to coronavirus (COVID-19) to help ease some of the financial stress and burden caused by the pandemic.

Through this program FEMA is reimbursing up to \$9,000.00 per funeral and a maximum of \$35,000 per application. You may qualify if:


- 1. You are a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national, or qualified alien who paid for funeral expenses after January 20, 2020, and
- 2. The funeral expenses were for an individual whose death in the United States, territories or the District of Columbia, may have been caused by or was likely the result of COVID-19.

A reminder that the COVID vaccine is now available to ALL veterans regardless of age.

On March 24, President Biden signed the **SAVE LIVES Act** which authorizes the VA to provide the COVID vaccine to veterans who are not enrolled in VA health care, veterans on the Foreign Medical Program, some registered veteran caregivers, recipients of Civilian Health and Medical Programs, and veteran spouses as well.
